Did you buy any of your materials as ready made components or parts or did you cut and shape things yourself?

Is there anything else the judges need to know about your design that will help them understand how you were inspired and how it works (carry on on a separate sheet if necessary).

Note for teachers: Tell us more about how you used the competition e.g. as a homework, running it as a module with several classes, as an internal competition with the best entries being submitted. This will help the judges decide who wins the teacher prize.
